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Governor of Bihar Inspires Students at Patna Crossword Contest and NICE Zonal Round at CIMP, Organized by Extra-C

Patna, August 16, 2024 — CIMP hosted the Patna Crossword Contest cum NICE Zonal Round today at its auditorium. This event organised by EXTRA-C attracted crossword enthusiasts ranging from seasoned solvers to novices, fostering intellectual engagement and camaraderie.
