Event Objectives

- To promote creativity and innovation by making useful products from waste materials.
- To encourage environmental awareness and recycling among participants.
- To foster teamwork and collaboration.

Pre-Event Planning

1. Venue Arrangement:

- Ensure the venue has enough space for participants to work comfortably.
- Set up tables or workstations for each individual or team.
- Arrange waste bins for disposal of non-reusable items.

2. Materials Provided:

- Informing participants to bring waste materials as per their need such as newspapers, plastic bottles, cardboard, old CDs, broken toys, etc.
- Provide additional basic materials like glue, scissors, colors, tape, and paint.

4. Rules and Guidelines:

- Participants must create something useful or innovative out of waste.
- Teams of 2-3 or individuals.
- Duration of the competition: 2 hours
- All materials must be non-hazardous and safe to use.
- Participants should label their creation with a brief description of the product and materials used.

5. Judging Criteria:

- Creativity and Innovation (30%)
- Utility and Practicality (30%)
- Aesthetic Appeal (20%)
- Use of Waste Material (20%)

6. Judging Panel:

- 2 judges who can evaluate based on the criteria.

Event Day Instructions

1. Welcome and Introduction (15 minutes):

- Welcome the participants and audience.
- Explain the competition rules and timeline.

2. Waste Material Collection Check (10 minutes):

- Ensure participants have brought waste materials and basic tools.
- Distribute any additional materials if needed.

3. Competition Start (2 hours):

- Officially announce the start of the competition.
- Participants begin working on their projects.
- Announce periodic time updates (every 30 minutes).

4. Judging Round (30-45 minutes):

- Once time is up, participants will stop working.
- The judges will go to each table, view the creations, and ask the participants to explain their concept and materials.

- Each participant/team presents their work to the judges in a 2-minute presentation.

5. Award Announcement and Closing Ceremony (30 minutes):

- Declare winners: First prize - ₹5,000, Second prize - ₹3,000 and Third prize - ₹2,000
- Apart from the above prizes, participation certificates will be awarded to all individuals.
